We focus on rest-of-life care and bringing joy to patient's lives. Our team share a dynamic, proactive ethos and our expert nurses and health practitioners are passionate about delivering excellent care based on individual wishes and choice. We also work with families to offer bereavement services and together with support from our fantastic community and volunteers we reach 4,500 patients and family members every year.

In 2025 we will proudly celebrate 40 years of the Hospice as a centre of clinical excellence in our region and further afield.

Tapping House was set up by healthcare professionals and local volunteers responding to a need for dedicated support for those with life-limiting conditions in our community. This continues to be the basis of our work: skilled professionals and trained volunteers working as a team to provide a wide range of extraordinary care services.

We currently provide care to around 1,500 patients a year and around 3,000 members of our community. Whether this be in our inpatient unit (IPU), through hospice at home or in our outpatient Tulip Centre.

Extraordinary Team delivering Outstanding Care:

Dr Hugh Ford Inpatient Unit

Our nurse led unit at the Hospice provides 24 hour compassionate palliative support and care for patients facing a life-shortening illness.

Hospice at Home

Our nurse led team providing end of life care and support for people in the last 6 weeks of life in the comfort of their own home.

Rapid Response

We have an overnight service that provides expert telephone advice, support and signposting for healthcare professionals and family caregivers, as well as rapid response to unplanned care in the home.

Tulip Centre

Our outpatient unit supports patients and their families at the start of their journey with us. We offer a wide choice of rehabilitation activities and therapy to enhance independence and quality of life.

Emotional, Social and Pastoral Support Services

We provide patients and their families with emotional and spiritual support during the palliative phase of life and into bereavement. Our service is multifaith or no-faith according to the person and offers a simple but crucial space to reflect, grieve and mend at an indescribably difficult time.



Compassionate Communities

We know that social connections within communities are a key to helping people living with serious illness, managing caring roles and coping with bereavement and grief. Our education programme supports the community of healthcare professionals, groups and individuals to reconsider death, dying and grief and be better able to foster connections with those people in their community in their phase of life.
