
This wonderful initiative will symbolically Light up and provide hope to people in our community, to shine a light on the work of the Hospice and demonstrate the support of our business community.

When no illness is the same, we offer one-of-a-kind care. From cancers to Huntingdon's Disease, we're expertly trained to support every one of the patients we serve every day.

We focus on rest-of-life care and bringing joy to patient's lives. Our team share a dynamic, proactive ethos and our expert nurses and health practitioners are passionate about delivering excellent care based on individual wishes and choice. We also work with families to offer bereavement services and together with support from our fantastic community and volunteers we reach 4,500 patients and family members every year.

Tapping House was set up by healthcare professionals and local volunteers responding to a need for dedicated support for those with life-limiting conditions in our community. This continues to be the basis of our work: skilled professionals and trained volunteers working as a team to provide a wide range of extraordinary care services.

We currently provide care to around 1,500 patients a year and around 4,500 members of our community. Whether this be in our inpatient unit (IPU), through hospice at home or in our outpatient Tulip Centre.

#### **Dr Hugh Ford Inpatient Unit**

#### **Hospice at Home**

Our nurse ledteam providing end of life care and support for people in the last 6 weeks of life in the comfort of their own home.



### **Rapid Response**

Wehave an overnight service that provides expert telephone advice, support and signposting for healthcare professionals and family caregivers, as well as rapid response to unplanned care in the home.

Our outpatient unit supports patients and their families at the start of their journey with us. We offer a wide choice of rehabilitation activities and therapy to enhance independence and quality of life.
